Pay for Quality Provider Incentive Plan

Through our Pay for Quality (P4Q) program, we reward you for helping us meet HEDIS® quality measure standards. The goal of our program is to target Medicaid members who need one or more HEDIS-measured procedures or visits completed during the 2021 calendar year. Program objectives are to improve targeted clinical quality results, promote safe and effective patient care, and increase preventive care services for our members.

Only those PCP's not participating in other provider incentive programs like PQIP and PQIP Essentials and/or shared savings agreements are eligible to participate in this program.

IET-AD Initiation of Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse or Dependence Treatment	Percentage of beneficiaries age 18 and older with a new episode of alcohol or other drug (AOD) abuse or dependence who received the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Initiation of AOD Treatment. Percentage of beneficiaries who initiate treatment through an inpatient AOD admission, outpatient visit, intensive outpatient encounter or partial hospitalization, telehealth, or medication treatment within 14 days of the diagnosis. 	\$20
IET-AD Engagement of Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse or Dependence Treatment	Percentage of beneficiaries age 18 and older with a new episode of alcohol or other drug (AOD) abuse or dependence who received the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Engagement of AOD Treatment. Percentage of beneficiaries who initiated treatment and who were engaged in ongoing AOD treatment within 34 days of the initiation visit. 	\$20

APP First-Line Psychosocial Care (12-17 yrs)	Percentage of adolescents ages 12 to 17 who had a new prescription for an antipsychotic medication and had documentation of psychosocial care as first-line treatment.	\$20

Frequently asked questions

When can I expect to receive my incentive payments?

There will be one incentive payment for 2021. The payment is scheduled to be made in July 2022.

How can I expect to receive my incentive payment?

If you are currently enrolled in electronic funds transfer (EFT), you will receive your payment via EFT. If you are not currently enrolled in EFT and receive mailed checks, you will receive this payment via the United States Postal Service.

If I am not the member's PCP, can I still receive the incentive?

No, only the member's assigned PCP is eligible to earn the incentive.

How will Healthy Blue know if I provided one of the services above?

Incentives will be determined based on claims data received. It is imperative that you bill using the appropriate CPT®/HEDIS-compliant code in order to ensure an incentive payment.

How does this information feed into the monthly *Missed Opportunity Report* I am receiving?

Our incentive plan and monthly *Missed Opportunity Report* are directly related. The incentive is only payable for those members who appear on the report and receive the specific services identified in the report.
